In most cases, when we follow up with a phone call to parents, we discover that they have been picked up, yet no communication to the teacher or office was made. If you arrive after dismissal and are picking up your child, please report directly to the bus supervisor (outside by the nature playground) to advise her that your child will not be on the bus. Thanks in advance for your cooperation. This enables us to know that all children are accounted for and have a safe ride home.
