committed to practicing kindness and treating others with respect. This day also highlights two


parts of our Code of Conduct: Caring and Respect.

# Lost or Damaged Library Books

If your child has lost or damaged a library book the following procedures have been put in place for parents/guardians to reimburse the school library in order that we recover the basic cost of the book:

- 1. If your child has a lost book, Ms. Bouvier will have a conversation with your child reminding them to return the book.
- 2. If they do not, Ms. Bouvier provides a written reminder to your child which they are supposed to bring home requesting that you look for the book with your child. Hopefully this notice makes it home!
- 3. If the book is not returned, or if a book is returned but the book is damaged, you will receive a request from Ms. Bouvier to cover the cost of the book.
- 4. In order to pay for the lost or damaged book, you will be asked to pay

- using Cash On Line. The cost for soft cover books is \$10, the cost for hardcover books is \$15. Once you have paid the school office receives a notification.
- 5. Don't be alarmed if you are looking at your child's Cash On Line Account next week and see "a lost or damaged book charge"; you only need to pay this if you receive a notice from Ms. Bouvier the librarian.

Before School Student Arrival
Procedures- We need your support
ensuring your children's health and
safety. It is expected that all students,
regardless of assigned
cohort, remain two meters apart when
arriving at school in the morning prior to

arriving at school in the morning prior to the 8:25AM bell. You can support this by ensuring that your children do not arrive at school or get dropped off (excluding bus students) any earlier than ten minutes before the 8:25AM bell. If students

adhere to the two meter rule, we will be able to maintain an "open playground" before



school. If this does not work, I will have no alternative but to assign cohorts to a specific area (similar to recess and lunch). Working together, I am hopeful that before school we can maintain arrival procedures where students are free to roam. Time will tell, let's work together on this to ensure some regularity for students as it pertains to before school procedures.

### End of Day Departure Procedures

In a normal year, parents and students often hang out on the playground after school, students play, parents visit and it develops a true sense of community. Unfortunately, this year that doesn't make sense, we need to be far more vigilant, the following departure

- procedures will ensure the health and safety of your children:
- We ask that all students, with the exception of bus students, leave school property immediately when the bell goes.
- ✓ At the end of the day, the priority on the playground is for our bus students, supervision of these students/ensuring social distancing is much easier for Ms. Elise when there are no other students on the playground.
- ✓ If students/families want to return to play, we ask that you return after 3:30PM when the final school bus has departed.
- ✓ Students that walk home are expected to leave the school grounds once dismissed by their teacher.
- ✓ Parents that meet their children outside the classroom and/or pick their children up are asked to leave the property, you are welcome to return to the school grounds after 3:30PM when the final bus leaves.
- ✓ We encourage families to have on off-site meeting location whenever possible.
